February 25 -- Lynn and Jan Dash, who have for years been urging for the reduction of carbon dioxide that has been driving global warming, will explain at Brookdale Community College the latest warnings of UN/IPCC reports that find climate change is accelerating, and suggest climate risk management actions to mitigate climate change. Their talk, free and open to the public, will be at 6 pm, Monday, Feb. 25 at Brookdale's Lincroft campus.

Dr. Jan Dash is the Editor of the forthcoming World Scientific Climate Encyclopedia and is Lead Climate Advisor to the NGO Committee on Sustainable Development (NY). He recently retired from a career in quantitative finance and risk management, and was a physics professor. His wife, Lynn, an indefatigable speaker on the disastrous effects of global warming, is the volunteer NJ State Coordinator of the grass-roots Citizens' Climate Lobby (CCL), and one of the founding members of the Monmouth Community Climate Coalition. Both were

credentialed NGO observers at the international climate conferences in Copenhagen and Paris. The Dashes have called global warming the "greatest survival and ethical issue of our time."

The IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) reports, based on expert research, conclude that man-made global warming and climate change are getting worse, which adversely affects, for example, worldwide food supplies, water and air quality, temperature-related impacts, rising sea levels, and extreme weather patterns that endanger both human and animal health and survival.

Their presentation, part of the BCC/Sierra Club's "Science Monday" series of environmental lectures, is hosted by BCC's Environmental Club to encourage students to be involved in statewide and national debates on the importance of strong environmental protections. The BCC/Sierra environmental science series is now in its 10th year.

A free pizza and subs buffet begins at 6:00 p.m. in Warner Student Life Center (SLC) Twin Lights Rooms I and II, and the presentation begins at 6:30 p.m.
